

## Announcement of Winners of the 25<sup>th</sup> National Japan Bowl<sup>®</sup>

Townsend Harris (NY) and Lake Braddock (VA) win first place in Level 4

CHEVY CHASE, M.D. – The National Japan Bowl® celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary on April 6-7, 2017, at the National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, Maryland. This year, 170 students from 28 high schools throughout the nation, as well as the national championship team from Mexico, came together to test their knowledge of Japanese language and culture.

The top Level 4 winners, Townsend Harris High School (New York) and Lake Braddock High School (Virginia), will travel to Japan this summer thanks to the generous support of the Mazda Foundation. In all, 23 students will be awarded a trip to Japan through the Kakehashi Project, a cultural exchange program administered by the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
